Friends:

Jewish culture takes joy in life-cycle events, including the coming-of-age. We recently enjoyed the Bat Mitzvah of Mira Tomer-Lawhead. Nicely done, Mira!



And the joy is not yet over. On June 24, we'll join the Rosenbaum-Wisnioski family in celebration of Isaak's Bar Mitzvah. Let's revel in this season of *nachas* in our children.

As you will recall, following vandalism of the BJCC sign, representatives of our town's faith communities came together on March 23 for a program in support of our congregation. Subsequently, Ruth Grene and I had conversations with some faith leaders on how we might enhance understanding among our respective communities going forward. Among the ideas were: (1) visits to services, (2) speakers explaining our respective faith traditions, and (3) discussion of readings of mutual interest.

The BJCC welcomes guests and is willing to provide speakers. In the last regard, I will explain a bit more: there was shared interest in exploring, for example, how the monotheisms grew from a common root and how the respective belief systems differentiated historically and philosophically. We have started planning with a small group, exploring how discussions might be organized (in person, or by Zoom) and what we might do (read well-chosen articles or books of mutual interest). Once we have a well-developed concept, we will invite other faith leaders and the respective communities to join in.

Work to enhance security of our building is still on hold, but we can see some positive developments. Since we use a historic building, we needed to send an "Environmental and Historic Preservation"(EHP) form and photos to FEMA for review. Though FEMA has rescinded its hold on Virginia projects, we were told to not proceed with any aspect of this project until we receive a formal EHP Approval Letter. So, we wait...

CEMETERY INFO

The BJCC has entered into an agreement with the Memorial Gardens of the New River Valley (MGNRV) to set aside a Jewish section of this commercial cemetery, which is located at the northern end of Main Street in Blacksburg where it runs into Route 460. Contact Cindy Turner (cturner@memorialgardensnrv.com) or Jim Lucas (jlucas@memorialgardensnrv.com) of the MGNRV at 552-7800 if you'd like to visit the Jewish section of the cemetery. Several plots have already been purchased; others are still available. BJCC members and their Jewish or non-Jewish immediate family members, and nonmembers who are Jewish, are eligible to purchase plots in this section.

The BJCC and MGNRV have agreed on a set of regulations aimed at maintaining the Jewish character of this section in perpetuity. If you are considering such a purchase, please speak with a member of the BJCC cemetery committee (Eric Hallerman, Muriel Kranowski, and Marta Brinberg) for an explanation of these regulations. If you are not a member of the BJCC, your purchase will need to be approved by the cemetery committee.
