The BJCC's mission is to serve the Jewish community in the New River Valley. No one will be turned away due to a lack of financial resources.

## CEMETERY INFO

The BJCC has entered into an agreement with Memorial Gardens of the New River Valley (MGNRV) to designate a Jewish section in this locally owned cemetery, situated at the northern end of Main Street in Blacksburg. Visit [www.memorialgardensrv.com/jewish-gardens.php](http://www.memorialgardensrv.com/jewish-gardens.php) if you're interested in purchasing burial plots in the Jewish section. Several plots have already been purchased; others are still available. BJCC members, their Jewish or non-Jewish immediate family members, and non-members who are Jewish are eligible to buy plots in this area.

The BJCC and MGNRV have agreed on a set of regulations to maintain this section's Jewish character in perpetuity. If you are considering such a purchase, please speak with a member of the BJCC cemetery

committee (Eric Hallerman, Muriel Kranowski, and Marta Brinberg) to explain these regulations. If you are not a BJCC member, your purchase must be approved by the cemetery committee.

## PJ BOOK NOOK INFO

Chanukah begins on Sun., Dec. 14 and runs through Mon., Dec. 22. Our Book Nooks can supply you with Hanukkah stories, ideas for crafts, and lots of recipes!

Of special note: PJ Library's *A Time to Hope* is a beautifully illustrated guide to the four Jewish holidays that fall each year between November and March: Sigd, an Ethiopian Jewish

holiday of homecoming; Chanukah, the festival of lights; Tu B'Shevat, the birthday of the trees; and Purim, the holiday of turnarounds. They are joyful celebrations of hope. A hard copy of this book is available in the



### How to Use our Book Nooks for PJ Library

- Color Coding
  - Teal bins—ages 9+.
  - Royal blue ages 6 months to 8 years—books for younger children in the front; topics are labeled on the front of the bin.
  - White bins—adults.
  - Hot pink bin—for book cards and returns.
- Each bin has a QR code on the left side; scan it to view a list of books in that bin, including photos of the covers, titles, and suggested age ranges.
  - Tap on a book to get more info, such as theme, genre, and the last date it was sent to PJ subscribers.
- Please check out and return books and games with a library book card. Cards and returns can be left in the hot pink bins.
